Grades 1–2

Time: 9am–4pm. Students should bring a lunch and a drink. Lunchtime supervision is provided. Dress for mess!

Grades 3–8

Time: Full days, 9am–4pm or half days, 9am–noon and 1–4pm. For full-day participation, students should bring a lunch and a drink. Lunchtime supervision is provided for full-day attendance only. Dress for mess!

Half days: \$115/week;

Programs for students entering grades 1–2 are scheduled for an all-day experience. For students entering grades 3 through 8, programs are designed for half-day experiences, but can be combined to provide an all-day experience. One program (Installation Art) for students entering grades 6 through 8 provides an all-day experience.

Early Drop Off/Late Pick Up

Early drop off is available from 7:30–9am for \$5 per day, per child. Late pick up is available from 4–5:30pm for \$5 per day, per child (an additional \$1 per minute charge will be incurred for pick up later than 5:30pm).

June 8-12

Artes Mexicano
9am-4pm

Discover the beauty of Mexico's traditions and cultures as you explore art forms like weaving, yarn drawing and hand-building with clay. Create a self-portrait in the style of Mexican artist Frida Kahlo and a mural painting in the tradition of Diego Rivera.

June 15-19

Asian Adventure
9am-4pm

From the Japanese art of Gytaku (fish prints) to Chinese ceramics, explore the arts of Asia as you learn about cultures of this fascinating continent. Learn traditional brushpainting, printmaking, make a fish kite and more.

June 22-26

Aztec to Zapotec
9am-4pm

Mysteries of the Ancient Americas unfold as you explore kingdoms from the Aztec and Zapotec of Mexico to the Inca of Peru! Weave a textile, craft a water jug, design an awesome mask and create jewelry that any ancient ruler would have worn proudly.

JUNE 29-JULY 2*

Towers, Ceilings and Chandeliers
9am-4pm

Become a "Chihuligan" as you spend the week learning about the blown glass sculpture of Dale Chihuly and other artists who work in glass. Design your own tower, chandelier and other "glass" works of art. Then make individual pieces that, combined with others, create a Chihuly ceiling!

July 6-10

Walk Like an Egyptian
9am-4pm

"Strut with Tut" as you unlock mysteries of this ancient kingdom! Design a mural for a pyramid wall, create a headdress fit for an Egyptian ruler, make a miniature sarcophagus and design hieroglyphs. Pssst... don't forget to tell your "mummy!"

Time Travelers
9am-4pm

From cave paintings of France to contemporary art of today, explore art throughout history. Create a Roman mosaic, design medieval stained glass, create a Native American quill headdress, and paint with Picasso, just to name a few!

Critter Capers

Explore the wonderful world of animal stories in an exhibition of children's book illustrations by renowned illustrator Jerry Pinkney. Then, inspired by illustrations for *Aesop's Fables*, *The Ugly Duckling* and *Uncle Remus Tales*, explore animals in art as you paint, print and sculpt!

Out of Africa
9am-4pm

Explore a continent that is home to many different cultures and beautiful works of art. Create a ceremonial mask, design your own headdress and learn the art of mud painting. Then, sculpt animals of the safari!

Artists, Architects and Builders

Colors of Nature

Explore a variety of media, as well as color theory, as you focus on the beauty of natural forms like artists such as Georgia O'Keeffe. Learn to use color effectively while working in paint, pastel and more.

Altered Books

Materials fee: \$10

Learn new techniques as you explore this "anything goes" art medium that transforms discarded books into works of art! Make a journal, create a self-themed book and craft a scrapbook to store your favorite mementos and art projects.

Drawing as Seeing

Materials fee: \$10

From Leonardo da Vinci to Georgia O'Keeffe, drawing has been used by artists as a way to see and study the world. Use various drawing media as a way to explore objects and then create a still life masterpiece.

Cultures around the world have made fibers a fabulous form of art! Study textiles from Africa and Peru, and experiment with thread, yarn and other materials as you create pouches, bookmarks and tapestries.

Installation Art

Materials fee: \$20

Explore three-dimensional space in a creative way in this all-day workshop. Learn how to redefine existing objects into works of art. Experiment with paint, fiber and other media as you transform two-dimensional and three-dimensional objects. Use collaborative skills to create an actual installation.

Graffiti Art

Materials fee: \$10

Discover artists such as Jean-Michael Basquiat, Keith Haring and Crash (John Matos), who helped make graffiti a recognized art form. Learn the basics of painting styles and color theory to create art in the style of graffiti with all of the beauty, none of the harm.

Plaster Sculpture

Materials fee: \$15

Inspired by American artists John Ahearn and Rigoberto Torres, enjoy sculpture projects that feature plaster as you explore casting, wrapping and carving.

Experiment with painting media on unconventional surfaces such as glass, plaster and even sandpaper. Create daring works of art that go beyond what's expected!
